### MEETING WITH THE MAYOR <<<

In April, we attended a mayoral meeting where updates on various development projects were shared. Hout Bay will receive 1.7 kilometres of new water pipes soon. Additionally, Victorskloof is already undergoing pipe replacements.



#### >>> SECURITY MEASURES

Recent security enhancements include:

- Installing more cameras along the Main Road boundary.
- Closing off the last weak spot in the CCTV network.
  - Installing a light at the Hughenden and Main Road intersection to help stop smash and grab attempts.
- Adding solar lights at the top of Hughenden.
- Clearing alien vegetation along the gully to the gully gate for a direct line of sight to a boundary fence.

All CCTV feeds and cameras are operational. This next financial year, we will identify old cameras and replace them with new spec, as well as explore backup power options for boundary cameras.

# SAFE PATHWAY AND <<<< Community Safety

We've raised several concerns about the safe pathway and area. We are working closely with the city to address them. Mark, our project manager, has been diligent in following up.





# ENVIRONMENTAL EFFORTS

We've been busy with various planting projects around the Moravian school and other areas using local indigenous plants.
